- A. As outlined in the Constitution and Bylaws of the Gila River Indian Community, Arizona (March 1960), Article VI, the Qualifications of Officers are:

Section 1. No person shall be elected or hold office as Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Chief Judge, Associate Judges or Councilmen unless he:

1. Is a member of the Community
2. Has reached the age of twenty-five (25) years
3. Has been living in the particular district he is to represent for at least sixty (60) days immediately preceding the election
4. Has been living on the Reservation for at least one year immediately preceding the election
5. Additional qualifications may be prescribed by ordinance.



Section 2. No person who, within the year preceding the election, has been convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude shall be eligible to hold office in the Community.

B. Under the Gila River Indian Community Code, Title 1- Administration of Community Affairs (as amended), Chapter 2 Official Misconduct, Section 1.201B.2, a “crime involving moral turpitude” is defined as,

- a. Under the laws of the Gila River Indian Community: Criminal Homicide, Sexual Assault, Kidnapping, Burglary, Robbery, Theft, Arson, Theft by Extortion, Forgery, Fraud, Fraudulent Use of a Credit Card, Telecommunications Fraud, Production or Delivery of Marijuana, Possession or Sale of Narcotics, Bribery, Perjury, Failure to Obey a Lawful Order of the Court, Driving while Intoxicated, Tampering with a Public Record, Prostitution, Promotion of Prostitution, Indecent Exposure, Sexual Abuse, Sexual Conduct with a Minor, Molestation of a child, Dangerous Use of Explosives, Abandonment of a Child, Child Non-Support, Child Abuse, Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor, Incest, Domestic Violence and Attempt, Solicitation, Conspiracy or Facilitation of any of the above listed crimes; and
- b. The same or similar offenses, as in paragraph 1 above, under any State or Federal Law, including crimes under 18 U.S.C. 1152, 18 U.S.C. 1153, assault resulting in serious bodily injury as defined under 18 U.S.C. 1365 and a felony under 18 U.S.C. 661.
