The high for today in the Community is 95 degrees and has a 50-20 percent of thunderstorms. Tonight will have a 30 percent chance of thunderstorms and a low of 43 degrees. By Wednesday, the clouds will start to decrease bringing temperatures back to the mid-100's. Thursday going into the weekend will be mostly sunny with warm temperatures and partly cloudy nights.

- When traveling during a rainstorm plan accordingly making sure your vehicle is rain ready by checking wiper blades, headlights and tires.
- Keep updated with weather activity to plan your day to day activities.
- When you receive a thunderstorm warning or hear thunder, go inside immediately
- Avoid flooded roadways. Turn Around. Don't Drown! Just six inches of fast-moving water can knock you down, and one foot of moving water can sweep your vehicle away.
- Watch for fallen power lines and trees. Report them immediately.
- Help people who may require special assistance, such as infants, children and the elderly or disabled

Always turn on wipers and headlights in low-light, stormy conditions. Turn on the fog lamps if your vehicle is equipped with them.



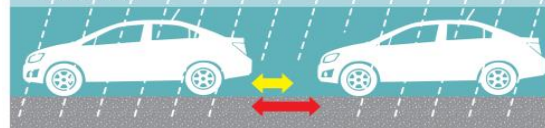
Be Cautious on Flooded Roads

Never drive through anything deeper than the center of your wheels. Check the fording depth of your vehicle.



Slow Down to Avoid Aquaplaning

Reduce speed on wet pavement to reduce risk of aquaplaning and add extra stopping distance.



Properly Inflate Tires

Check your pressure and tread condition. Over-inflated tires reduce grip. Under-inflated tires may result in dangerous aquaplaning.
