Parade Entry Liability Waiver and Release of Liability

(Please read this entire document and return the signed and completed form with the rest of your parade entry forms)

IN CONSIDERATION of being granted a position as an entrant and/or permission to participate in the 58th Annual Mul-Chu-Tha Fair and Rodeo Parade (the "Parade"), or on behalf of a minor child, the undersigned agrees and states as follows:

- 1. The undersigned is aware of, understands, and assumes all inherent risks, hazards and dangers associated with parade participation (printed below) and, notwithstanding that the actual conditions at the Parade may pose more or less risks, hazards and dangers than those so enumerated below.
- 2. The undersigned, for himself or herself and for his or her heirs, successors, assignees, personal representatives and next of kin, hereby releases, waives, discharges, covenants not to sue and agrees to hold harmless the Gila River Indian Community and the Community Services Department, as well as their officers, directors, agents, volunteers and employees, from all liability for any and all causes and claims of every type and nature whatsoever, including but not limited to property damage, personal injury and/or wrongful death or otherwise, without limitation, arising out of or alleged to be arising out of the conduct of the Parade, the pre-Parade formation, staging, placement, judging, organizational meetings, post-Parade ceremonies and any other Parade event sanctioned by the Community or Community Services Department.
- 3. The undersigned hereby promises that the state of his or her physical health (or if this release is on behalf of a minor) will, on the day of the Parade, be sufficiently sound to permit him or her to safely participate. If the undersigned (or if this release is on behalf of a minor) will be handling any animal, motorized vehicle, apparatus, device, firearm, or other thing in the Parade, he or she is possessed of sufficient experience in doing so that the life, limb or property of self and others will not be exposed to unreasonable risk of harm.

RISKS, HAZARDS AND DANGERS ASSOCIATED WITH PARADE PARTICIPATION

Parades involve inherent risks, hazards and conditions that may be dangerous to life, limb and property and that can arise in an incalculable variety of unforeseeable or foreseeable ways which may include, but are not limited to, the following: The presence and use of horse and other animals, motor vehicles, machinery, firearms, floats, projectiles, wind, rain, hail and other forces of the elements, and other threats to life and limb, such as the possibility of slipping and falling and complications associated with weather conditions and physical exertion (such as heat stroke, fainting, collapse, exhaustion or other more serious complications).

I acknowledge that I have read the above Liability Waiver and Release of Liability, understand its content, agree with its terms, and by signing it agree it is my intention to exempt and relieve the Gila River Indian Community and the Gila River Indian Community Community Services Department from liability for property damage, personal injury, and/or

MUL-CHU-THA PARADE INFORMATION AND GUIDELINES

Theme: ""Celebrating the legacy of sports & honoring our O'Otham & Pee Posh Champions"

All parade participants must adhere to the following guidelines:

Parade Information

- 1. Parade will be approximately 1.5 miles, starting at the intersection of Bluebird Road and Gu' U Ki Road, proceeding East on Bluebird Rd., left on Cholla Rd., ending at Seed Farm Road.
- 2. Announcement stands will be located in three places: 1) 800 yards (approximately) pass the intersection of Bluebird Road and Gu' U Ki Road; 2) on the South East corner of Ocotillo and Bluebird Road, and 3) on the South side just before Cholla Rd. and Bluebird Rd.
- 3. The Judging stand will be located at the South East corner of Ocotillo and Bluebird Rd.
- 4. Parade Entry Liability Waiver and Release of Liability will need to be completed at time of registration, and verification of safety officers.

Entry Information

- 1. Parade Registration/Line-up will begin at 6:00am and end at 8:30am.
- 2. ALL motorized vehicles/trailer entries MUST submit a copy of a valid driver's license and proof of vehicle insurance. Entries will not be accepted or allowed to participate if not submitted with application.
- 3. The parade entry number must be picked up at the registration table located on the North side of Seed Farm Rd. and Pear Rd. Parade entry arrivals after 8:30am will be placed at the end of the parade line-up and will not be judged; this includes any walk-ins.
- 4. Parade entries will place their number on the **right side of entry** so it is visible to the judges.
- 5. It is mandatory that each parade entrant supply two parade officers to accompany the parade entry. Officers must be 16 years of age or older and must be able to walk on the left and rear right, of the parade entry. Their role will be to keep moving along the parade route at all times and keep up with the parade pace. Groups should stay at least (2) car lengths behind the entry ahead.
- 6. To ensure the flow of the parade and to avoid backup, performances are limited to **2 minutes** at each judge/announcement stand. Entries that do not abide by time limit will be penalized.
- 7. For the safety of the public and parade participants. **NO OBJECTS** may be thrown into the crowd from vehicles or floats during the parade for *example*: *candy*, *coupons*, *photos*, *promotional items*, *fruit*, *etc*. *Failure to comply may result in exclusion from participating in future parades*.
- 8. Parade participants wishing to distribute items may walk along the parade route and hand out items, but must keep up with parade pace and not disrupt other participants.
- 9. Jumping on and off vehicles, floats, etc., is strictly prohibited.
- 10. All children must be supervised by an adult(s) on the vehicle, floats, etc.
- 11. Equestrian entries MUST provide a volunteer to clean up behind their entry. This will be verified at time of registration.
- 12. Please ensure your parade participants are aware of your group Organization Name and Contact person (this will help with individual who are dropped off at the shuttle located at Seed Farm Rd. east of the parade registration table).

Awards Information

- 13. Awards will be provided for first, second, and third place in the following categories:
 - Float (School/Club)
 - Marching Unit
 - Royalty
 - Governor's Award Float (Department/Entity)



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• The Lieutenant's Award- Dance Group

Prizes will be awarded at 3:00pm, March 8th at the MCT fair grounds, Battle of the Bands tent.

Line up Transportation

A shuttle will be available for parade entry participants to transport to the parade line up to drop off points closest to their parade entry. The shuttle will also be available for participants at the conclusion of the parade to bring passengers back to their parked vehicles or to be picked up. **Absolutely no vehicles will be allowed to drop off at the parade line up.** The contact person regarding the shuttling service will be Megan Yellowhorse, Administrative Assistant Community Services Department at (520) 610-8472. Pick-up and drop off information is provided below:

- Participants can park their vehicles or be dropped off at the Parade Participant Drop-Off site along Seed Farm Road (near registration area), south of the main MCT fairgrounds.
- At the conclusion of the parade, a shuttle will be available to shuttle participants back to the
 designated "participant / drop off area on Seed Farm Road to retrieve their parked vehicles or to
 be picked up. The shuttles will depart the parking lot of the Sacaton Boys & Girls Club located at
 116 S. Holly St. Sacaton, AZ 85147. Chairs, shade, and water will also be available at this site.
 Parking for the purpose of picking-up participants will be on Seed Farm Road and will be marked
 accordingly with "PARADE PARTICIPANT PARKING" signs.
