Grupo Metál Featuring Chris Perez Announced as Entertainment Act for 58th Annual Mul-Chu-Tha Fair and Rodeo

Former Members of Selena y Los Dinos Chris Perez & Joe Ojeda Pay Homage to The Queen of Tejano

Sacaton, AZ - The Mul-Chu-Tha Fair and Rodeo is excited to announce this year's entertainment act for the fair and rodeo's annual concert series. Grupo Metál featuring Chris Perez & Joe Ojeda will perform on the main stage, Saturday, March 7, 2020 at 8:00 p.m. in Sacaton, Arizona.

Grupo Metál, along with Chris Perez & Joe Ojeda formerly of Selena y Los Dinos, pays homage to the Queen of Tejano. San Antonio Texas based Metál is known for their all-star lineup of musicians and impressive imitating sound, performing rock español artists like Mana, Juanes, and Caifanes. Metál was established in 1991 and got the opportunity to tour with Selena y Los Dinos. Soon after, Metál changed their genre of music & worked with artist like Intocable, Pepe Aguilar & Alejandra Guzman to name a few. Metál is excited to take this show dedicated to the Queen of Tejano on the road, share personal stories, songs she liked and perform her hits accompanied with on screen visuals. Metál will also pay homage to Prince, George Michael, David Bowie and Michael Jackson.

Chris Perez was the lead guitarist for Los Dinos from 1989 to 1995, and recorded hits Como la Flor, La Carcacha and Bidi Bidi Bom Bom. In 1999, Perez recorded his Grammy award winning album Resurrection, and in 2000 he joined Kumbia Kings. In 2011 Chris began collaborating with Grupo Metál, and released his book, To Selena With Love. The show will take you back in time and allow you to experience the sound and story behind it all. Get ready to sing, dance and celebrate 25 years with Grupo Metál featuring Chris Perez.

The Mul-Chu-Tha Fair and Rodeo will take place March 6-8, 2020. The three-day celebration brings neighboring tribes and visitors together for a weekend of festivities. The main stage concert is free with the price of fair admission. Seats are available on a first come first serve basis.
