

Interstate 10 Pavement Improvement Project: Gila River Bridge to State Route 587

The Arizona Department of Transportation is working to improve the pavement on three miles of Interstate 10 in Pinal County within the Gila River Indian Reservation. Work will occur from east of the Gila River Bridge to east of the State Route 587 traffic interchange. The project began in August 2017 with completion anticipated early-to-mid June 2018.



Crews are scheduled to replace guardrail and install raised pavement markings through the end of April. Rubberized asphalt paving is scheduled to occur from the end of April through mid-May. Crews are scheduled to return in June and complete final lane striping.

Work is generally scheduled to occur Sunday through Thursday nights on east- and westbound I-10, and on the ramps at the SR 587 traffic interchange.

The project includes removing the existing asphalt and replacing it with smooth, durable rubberized asphalt; installing new guardrail; installing pavement markings; seeding; and other work.

What to expect:

- I-10 will be narrowed to one lane in the work zone
- The on- and off-ramps at SR 587 could be closed intermittently; drivers can use SR 387 or Riggs Road as alternate routes
- Slow traffic and delays are possible, so allow extra travel time
