



QUESTION #1
Currently, Article III, Section 3 of the Constitution states that a Community member who remains away from the Reservation continuously for 20 years shall automatically forfeit his or her tribal membership.
A YES vote will remove this language from the Constitution and allow Community members to keep their tribal membership even if they remain away from the Reservation continuously for 20 years.
A NO vote will keep the current Constitution language.
SHALL ARTICLE III, SECTION 3 OF THE GILA RIVER INDIAN COMMUNITY CONSTITUTION BE REMOVED?

QUESTION #2
Currently, Article XI, Section 1 of the Constitution states that the area known as Co-op shall be within District 6; however, the legal boundaries stated in Article XI place Co-op within District 7.
A YES vote will change the legal boundaries of District 7 and District 6 to move the area known as Co-op from District 7 to District 6.
A NO vote will keep the current Constitution language.
SHALL ARTICLE XI, SECTION 1 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE GILA RIVER INDIAN COMMUNITY BE AMENDED BY CHANGING THE LEGAL BOUNDARIES OF DISTRICT 7 AND DISTRICT 6 TO MOVE THE AREA KNOWN AS CO-OP FROM DISTRICT 7 TO DISTRICT 6?

QUESTION #3
Currently, Articles III and XIV of the Constitution state that the Secretary of the Interior has authority to review and approve certain kinds of ordinances and resolutions enacted by the Community Council, including civil and criminal codes, and ordinances regulating tribal membership.
