













Weather Outlook

STORM PREPAREDNESS

- When traveling during a rainstorm plan accordingly making sure your vehicle is rain ready by checking wiper blades, headlights and tires.
- Keep updated with weather activity to plan your day-to-day activities.
- When you receive a thunderstorm warning or hear thunder, go inside immediately.
- Avoid flooded roadways. Turn Around. Don't Drown! Just six inches of fast-moving water can knock you down, and one foot of moving water can sweep your vehicle away.
- Watch for fallen power lines and trees. Report them immediately.
- Help people who may require special assistance, such as infants, children and the elderly or disabled
