



DoxyPep for STI Prevention

SYPHILIS AWARE: PROTECT YOURSELF, PROTECT GILA RIVER

Doxycycline Post-Exposure Prophylaxis (DoxyPEP) is a medication used to prevent syphilis, gonorrhea, and chlamydia after unprotected vaginal, anal, or oral sex.

When should DoxyPep be taken?

DoxyPep should be taken within 24 hours but no more than 72 hours after condomless sex



Who can take DoxyPep?

- Gay, bisexual, and other cisgender men who have sex with men
- Transgender women with a history of at least one bacterial STI (gonorrhea, chlamydia or syphilis) in the last 12 months.

Does DoxyPep prevent other STIs?

- DoxyPep does not protect against Mpox (monkeypox), HIV, HPV, Genital herpes, HBV, or other viral infections
- Talk to your health care provider about pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) and post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) for HIV prevention
- Get tested regularly for STIs/HIV and practice safe sex
