Rain Safety Tips:











For those GRIC Employees who work outdoors: below are a few safety tips:

- Thunderstorms are dangerous storms that cause powerful winds, create lightning and hail. Also can cause flash floods.
- Avoid traveling in a severe storm. Stay updated with the weather. Ensure wipers are operating before driving.
- Be aware of dust storms when traveling. Pull off the roadway & set emergency brake/take foot off the brake. Stay inside vehicle until storm passed.
- If driving, and blocked by water over a roadway, wait for the water to subside or find an alternate route to your destination. Do not drive into the water.
- Residents are encouraged to check on the elderly family members or neighbors.

The weather today in the Community will be sunny with a high of 108 degrees and will have a low of 84 degrees. Tuesday will be mostly sunny then will have a slight chance for thunderstorms. Wednesday will have a 20 percent chance for thunderstorms and Wednesday night will have a 40 percent for thunderstorms. Thursday will have a 30 percent chance for thunderstorms. Friday going into the weekend will continue with thunder-storm activity with highs in the 100's and lows in the 80's.

What You Need To Know

- NO PLACE outside is safe when thunderstorms are in the area!
- If you hear thunder, lightning is close enough to strike you.
- When you hear thunder, immediately move to safe shelter.
- Safe shelter is a substantial building or inside an enclosed, metal-topped vehicle.
- Stay in safe shelter at least 30 minutes after you hear the last clap of thunder.

Indoor Lightning Safety Tips

- Stay off corded phones, computers, and other electrical equipment that put you in direct contact with electricity.
- Avoid plumbing... including sinks, baths, and faucets.
- Stay away from windows and doors, and stay off porches.
- Do not lie on concrete floors and do not lean against concrete walls.

Last Resort Outdoor Risk Reduction Tips

If caught outside with no safe shelter nearby, the following actions may reduce your risk:

- Immediately get off elevated areas such as hills, mountain ridges, or peaks.
- NEVER lie flat on the ground.
- NEVER use a tree, cliff, or rocky overhang for shelter.
- Immediately get out and away from ponds, lakes, and other bodies of water.
- Stay away from objects that conduct electricity (barbed wire fences, power lines, etc.).

If Someone Has Been Struck

- CALL 911 for help first.
- Victims do not carry an electrical charge and may need immediate medical attention.
- Monitor the victim and begin CPR or AED, if necessary.
