Subject: Election Protection for 2018 General Election

The Inter Tribal Council of Arizona is pleased to collaborate with Arizona State University – College of Law – Indian Legal Clinic to ensure that all American Indians have the right to vote for the 2018 General Election. ITCA and ASU Indian Legal Clinic will implement a three-tiered Election Protection project, which will include:

- 1) Volunteers, who are trained in non-partisan Election Protection, will be deployed at polling locations on and near tribal lands to provide assistance should a voter be turned away from the polls and other voting rights issues
- 2) A Command Center will be housed at the ASU Indian Legal Clinic where volunteers will provide assistance should a voter call the Native Vote Election Protection Hot-line, which is 1-888-777-3831
- 3) Volunteers lawyers will be on-call should there be a need of legal intervention
